
Booktalk Worksheet



 List the Title and Author:
 Start with an interesting question related to your book.
Example: Did you ever wonder what it would be like to be a wizard?
OPENING QUESTION: (NOTE: DON'T READ THESE HEADINGS AS YOU DO THE BOOKTALK!)
 Introduce the book in about 5 or 6 sentences. Tell a little about the main characters, the setting and the plot. Identify the genre. Don't give too much detail or give too much away! Don't bore your audience. SHORT SUMMARY:
 Mention your favorite part of the book or what you liked best about it.
MY FAVORITE PART/THE THING I LIKE BEST ABOUT THIS BOOK:
 If the book is available, pick a short <u>interesting</u> section to read aloud. Choose a part that is suspenseful or sad or weird. <u>Stop before you read</u> too much!! The idea is to make your audience want more.

 End with a really good question or closing statement to make your audience want more of the book
